



WEEKLY PRAYER POINTS

Sunday 3 (Focus on Holiness and Righteousness)

As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, "You shall be holy as I am holy." – 1 Pet 1:14-16

This week we will confess sins that relate to the **sanctity of life and human sexuality**: violence, assault, homicide and abuse; abortion, infanticide and euthanasia; lust, pornography, promiscuity and sexual perversions, etc. Confess your own sins as well as the sins of the Church and of America, then proceed to the following Prayer Points.

- 1) That the American Church would be characterized by **purity** and **unity**.
- 2) That the conviction of the Holy Spirit would fall heavily upon our media, sports, entertainment and tech industries; that God would raise up courageous believers to stand for truth and righteousness within our godless culture; and that He would bless and honor those who do.
- 3) For those working in our penal and law enforcement communities (and their families): that God would protect the righteous, purge the wicked and heal the rift between our police and the communities they are pledged to protect; that all sides would seek common ground in a spirit of love, compassion and repentance; and that fairness, equity, respect and due process would prevail within the system.
- 4) That the Body of Christ would be able, willing and empowered to break generational curses and to counter the demonic powers assaulting the biblical family unit, the sanctity of marriage and our God-ordained sexual identities.
- 5) For the unborn, that their lives would be valued and protected, and that the legalization of abortion and infanticide would be overturned.
- 6) For the Jewish people, the holy city of Jerusalem and the peace of Israel; and that the name of Yeshua the Messiah would be proclaimed and honored within its borders.
- 7) For our state officials, both elected and appointed.
- 8) That the ongoing election process might be open, transparent and peaceful; that the people of God would cast their votes; and that righteous candidates would triumph.
